Newark's Cristo Rey School Celebrates Inaugural Festivities

Christ the King Prep, sponsored by the Archdiocese of Newark and endorsed by the Sisters of Charity of Saint Elizabeth and the Marist Brothers of the Schools, opened its doors to its inaugural Class of 2011 on September 4, 2007. As Newark's Cristo Rey School, it became the latest member of the nationally acclaimed Network of 19 schools praised and featured in *Time*, *Newsweek* and on CBS' *60 Minutes*.

Christ the King celebrated its opening with a mass at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church followed by a reception program. All major news media covered the event, including NJN Channel 12, who reported: "The first new Catholic high school to open in Newark in 50 years...." Christ the King is bringing new hope to children in Newark."

At the inaugural liturgy, Father John P. Foley, S.J., President of the Cristo Rey Network and founding President of the first Cristo Rey High School, as well as Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, Regional Bishop for Essex County, and the entire congregation, gratefully celebrated our oneness in the Spirit as together we sang: "We are singing in the light of God!" At the inaugural reception, this light shone brightly in the faces of the over 250 guests present, including corporate partners, parents, trustees, Archdiocesan and religious community partners, community leaders, news media, friends and our students. Newark Mayor Cory Booker energetically declared: "We are now creating a bright beacon of hope within the city of Newark."

After the celebration, one quarter of the students went off to their first day of work while the others went to class. Afterward, Christ the King Prep student Andrew Emmanuel shared, "It was amazing. I'm so grateful for this opportunity to pursue my dreams." CTK Prep student Angelika Arias added, "I know for a fact that if I work hard this school will help me be successful. I plan to be a lawyer."

Archbishop's Reception

Most Reverend John J. Myers, J.C.D., D.D. sponsored a reception in support of Christ the King Prep on Thursday, November 8 at the Archbishop's residence. Over 70 guests heard the Archbishop Myers invite them to "turn in their friends," asking all present to share the good news of Christ the King with others. By "turning in your friends," he was quoting Trustees Bart Erbach and Jack Brennan and joining them in urging friends not only to support the school and its students, but also to reach out to others and invite them to do the same.

He also talked about the joy he felt when visiting Christ the King, and told guests how impressed he was with the staff and students with whom he spent time. He expressed his gratitude for the Cristo Rey Network and Christ the King Prep's commitment to educating economically disadvantaged young people in the Greater Newark Area. He reiterated his, and the Archdiocese's commitment to serving as sponsor for Christ the King Prep, the first Catholic high school to open in Newark in 50 years.

The Archdiocese of Newark has not only given Christ the King Prep the use of its school building at the site of Our Lady of Good Counsel, but also has helped the school with the promise of \$350,000 over its first three years. President Edward Glynn, S.J. thanked the Archbishop and guests for their interest and support. He also reminded friends that the CTK Prep mission is "all about education, all about work and all about caring for our young people."

Harlem Educational Field Trip

On October 24, Christ the King Prep students Tiffany Adams, Angelika Arias, Andrew Emanuel and Otis Johnson traveled with CTK Prep staff to Harlem to visit the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture and take a Harlem civil rights walking tour. On the trip, they explored issues of racial and social justice and civic responsibility. They learned about Martin Luther King, Jr., Malcolm X, Marcus Garvey, Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. and other African-American leaders who spent time in Harlem and influenced the civil rights movement in the United States. They also engaged in an educational, interactive exhibit at the Schomburg entitled, "Stereotypes to Human-types." It displayed how African-Americans and other minorities have been portrayed in harmful and derogatory ways in popular culture. It also challenged participants to look beyond stereo types, and recognize and celebrate our common humanity. It presented the myriad inspiring contributions to society and achievements made by African Americans and other minorities in America. Our students then visited the Apollo Theatre, Marcus Garvey Memorial Park, Ralph Ellison Memorial Statue, St. Phillip's Episcopal Church and other Harlem historic sites. They also spoke with actors filming a movie on the streets of Harlem. The actors encouraged our students to pursue their dreams and never give up. They ended the day with dinner at Sylvia's Restaurant, famous for

its soul food and celebrity patrons. Tiffany Adams shares, "the trip was very educational and fun. I took every opportunity to participate in discussions. I hope to go back again some day. I will continue to share what I learned with my classmates."
